

## Zig-zag squared scarf

This striking scarf is based on a traditional quilting patchwork design and is much simpler to knit than it looks. Large, soft and snuggly its ideal for colder weather. It also lends itself well to many different colourways - what will you create?

## Difficulty: easy intermediate

Techniques: picking up stitches, centre double decrease, short rows

## Measurements

Scarf measures approximately 170 cm (67in) long and 25 cm (10in) wide.

## Materials

Yarn: Aran yarn:

- approximately $2 \mathrm{~g}(4 \mathrm{~m})$ for each mitred square (total of 25 squares: $50 \mathrm{~g}, 100 \mathrm{~m}$ )
- approximately $13 \mathrm{~g}(25 \mathrm{~m})$ for each double stripe (total of 16 stripes: $210 \mathrm{~g}, 400 \mathrm{~m}$ )
- approximately $60 \mathrm{~g}(115 \mathrm{~m})$ for the border.

I used Paintbox Yarns Simply Aran in stormy grey, light caramel, soft fudge, pistachio green, vintage pink and peach orange.
Needles: 5 mm needles
Other: darning needle for sewing ends, lockable stitch markers

Tension: 18 sts and 24 rows to 10 cm (4in), worked in stocking stitch with 5 mm needles.

## Abbreviations

cm centimetres, cdd central double decrease (slip 1 st as if to knit, slip next st as if to knit, k1, then pass slipped sts over), in inches, k2tog knit 2 together, $\mathbf{m m}$ millimetres, $\mathbf{R H}$ right hand, RS right side, s slip st purlwise, st(s) stitch(es), st-st stocking stitch.

## Pattern Starts

## Construction diagram

The scarf is constructed from the centre out. The nine mitred squares in the centre of the scarf are completed first, then the stripes moving out from one side. Finally, the scarf is turned to complete the second half stripes before an edging is knitted all the way around.


Instructions are given for the component parts of the scarf first (mitred square and stripes). The instructions for knitting the scarf are given afterwards and refer back to the instructions for the components.

## Components

## Mitred square

Cast on or pick up 17 sts as directed by pattern.
$1^{\text {st }}$ row: purl.
$2^{\text {nd }}$ row: $\mathrm{s} 1, k 6$, CDD, k7
$3^{\text {rd }}$ and every alternative row: $\mathrm{s} 1, \mathrm{p}$ to end
$4^{\text {th }}$ row: s1, k5, CDD, k6
$6^{\text {th }}$ row: s1, k4, CDD, k5
$8^{\text {th }}$ row: $\mathrm{s} 1, \mathrm{k} 3$, CDD, k4
10 th row: s1, k2, CDD, k3
12 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ row: $\mathrm{s} 1, \mathrm{k} 1, ~ C D D, k 2$
14 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ row: $\mathrm{sl}, \mathrm{CDD}, \mathrm{kl}$
16 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ row: CDD
Do not do purl row. Place remaining st on st marker

## Stripe:

Pick up 26 sts as directed by pattern.
${ }^{\text {st }}$ row: sl, purl
$2^{\text {nd }}$ row: sl, knit
Repeat rows 1 and 2 a further 7 times.
Cast off.

## Central nine squares

$1^{\text {st }}$ square: Cast on 17 sts. work one mitred square.
$2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ square: Working with square just completed: With RS facing and central raised sts running to top right, pick up 8 sts along top edge then cast on 9 st. Work one mitred square.
$4^{\text {th }}$ square: Cast on 9 st, with RS facing, pick up 8 sts from right edge of $1^{\text {st }}$ square. Work square.
$5^{\text {th }}$ and $6^{\text {th }}$ square: Pick up 8 st along top side of $4^{\text {th }}\left(5^{\text {th }}\right)$ square. Take live st from st marker from $1^{\text {st }}\left(2^{\text {nd }}\right)$ square. Pick up 8 sts from $2^{\text {nd }}\left(3^{\text {rd }}\right)$ square. Work square as before.
$7^{\text {th }}$ square. Work as $4^{\text {th }}$ square, picking up sts from $4^{\text {th }}$ square.
$8^{\text {th }}$ and $9^{\text {th }}$ square: work as $5^{\text {th }}$ and $6^{\text {th }}$ squares, picking up sts from $5^{\text {th }}$ and $6^{\text {th }}$ square.

## The first stripes:

First RH stripe: With RS facing and all central raised sts on mitred squares to top right working on right edge of central nine squares, Pick up 8 sts from first square, place live st on needle, 8 sts from next square, place live st on needle, 8 sts from next square ( 26 sts ). Work stripe.
First LH stripe: With RS facing, and all central raised sts on mitred squares to top right, working on top edge of central nine squares, Pick up 8 sts from first square, place live st on needle, 8 sts from next square, place live st on needle, 8 sts from next square (26 sts). Work stripe.
Central square: With RS facing, pick up 8 sts from end of RH stripe, take live st from previous square, pick up 8 sts from LH stripe. Work square.

## Additional stripes

RH stripe: Working on stripe to the right of the central squares.
Miss 8 sts. Pick up 1 st in each of next 18 sts of stripe. Pick up 8 sts from central square (26sts)
Work stripe.
LH stripe: Working on stripe to the left of the central square
Pick up 8 sts from the central square, pick up 1 st in next 18 sts of previous stripe. (26 sts)
Work stripe.
Work central square as given in first stripes.
Keep adding additional strands until the scarf is half the desired length.

## Starting the second half

First RH stripe: With RS facing and all central raised sts on mitred squares to bottom left, working on right edge of 9 square block. Pick up 8 sts from first square, 1 st from junction between squares, 8 sts from next square, 1 st from junction between squares, 8 sts from next square (26 sts). Work stripe.
First LH stripe: With RS facing, and all central raised sts on mitred squares to bottom left, working on top edge of 9 square block, Pick up 8 sts from first square, 1 st from junction between squares, 8 sts from next square, 1 st from junction between squares, 8 sts from next square ( 26 sts). Work stripe.
Central square: With RS facing, pick up 8 sts from end of RH stripe, 1 st from base of previous square, pick up 8 sts from LH stripe. Work square.

## 2nd and every following stripe:

Now work as given for additional stripes to desired length.

## Edging

Provisionally cast on 4 sts (for a seamless finish, alternatively cast on 4 sts in your preferred method).
Orientate your work so that you can pick up sts along the last stripe, working away from the mitred square at the tip of the scarf.
${ }^{\text {st }}$ row: $k 4$, with RS of scarf facing pick up a st at junction between last stripe and mitred square.
$2^{\text {nd }}$ row: k2tog (the picked up st and next st on needle), k3
Repeat rows 1 and 2 picking up the next st along the edge each time.

## Turning an outside corner

Work along the side until you reach the corner.
$\mathbf{1}^{\text {st }}$ row: k4, pick up corner st
$2^{\text {nd }}$ row: k2tog, k3
$3^{\text {rd }}$ row: k3, turn
$4^{\text {th }}$ row and every alternative row: $k$
$5^{\text {th }}$ row k2, turn
$7^{\text {th }}$ row k1, turn
$9^{\text {th }}$ row: k2, turn
$11^{\text {th }}$ row: k3, turn
13 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ row: k4, pick up next s $\dagger$
14 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ row: k2tog k3
Repeat rows 13 and 14 until the next corner.

Turning an inside corner
3 edge sts before the corner:
$1^{\text {st }}$ row and every alternative row: $k$ to end and pick up next st
$2^{\text {nd }}$ row: k2tog, k2
$4^{\text {th }}$ row: k2tog, k 1
$6^{\text {th }}$ row: k 2 tog
You should have now reached the corner. You will start picking up sts along the next edge
$7^{\text {th }}$ row and every alternative row: $k$ to end and pick up st
$8^{\text {th }}$ row: k2tog, k 1
$9^{\text {th }}$ row: k2tog, k2
$11^{\text {th }}$ row: k2tog, k3
Continue along edge using all 4 sts until you reach the next corner.
Turning the corner on the short edges (the tips of the scarf)
These corners are worked the same as an outside corner. Instead of picking up the corner st, use the live st from the end of the mitred square.
Work along the side until you reach the corner.
$1^{\text {st }}$ row: $k 4$, place live st on needle
$2^{\text {nd }}$ row: k2tog (the live st and next st), k3
Now work as for the outside corner, from row 3 onwards.
Continue working around the edge until you meet the original cast on. Either graft the edges together with kitchener st if using a provisional cast on, or cast off and seam edges.

Weave in ends. There is unfortunately rather a lot of them.
